Number of Committee Members	Up to 21 Voting Members, 2 Ex-Officio Chair Vice Chair Immediate Past Chair 9 Members, Honolulu Board of REALTORS® 3 Members, REALTORS® Association of Maui 2 Members, Kaua'i Board of REALTORS® 2 Members, Hawai'i Island REALTORS® 2 Members, West Hawai'i Association of REALTORS® Ex-officio, HAR Government Affairs Chair Ex-Officio, HAR President
Method of Appointment	RPAC Trustees from the Member Board may be recommended by the Member Board President or President-elect and appointed by the HAR President with approval by the HAR Board of Directors.
Term of Office	Each member shall have terms of three years; reappointment is permitted subject to approval. Each member shall only serve up to six consecutive years.
Meeting Frequency	Up to 2 in-person meetings in odd number years and teleconferences as needed. Up to 4 in-person meetings in even number years, including candidate interviews (Election Year) and teleconferences as needed.
Role	The RPAC Board of Trustees shall have complete supervision and control over the affairs and funds of RPAC and shall establish and carry out all policies and activities of RPAC. The Board of Trustees may, from time to time, adopt policies and procedures or amend existing policies and procedures to govern RPAC's fundraising efforts in conformance with all applicable laws, the making of contributions and other expenditures in furtherance of its purposes, and the duties and responsibilities of members of the Board of Trustees.

Responsibilities

Help set goals to meet the Local Board and State participation, major investor, President Circle, and federal disbursement allocation goal.

Work with the State and Local Boards to hold fundraising activities.

Also, share ideas on successes done at Local Board and other REALTOR® events.

Communicate with the Local Board leadership and staff to participate in RPAC either through fundraising activities or participation by its leadership.

Participate in Candidate Interviews and make decisions on disbursements during election years.
